Safety Planning for Coronavirus

Kinship and Foster Family Network of Manitoba has developed two versions of a Safety Plan to assist kinship and foster parents clarify the family steps they are following in response to the coronavirus disease (covid-19).

These tools were developed in response to kinship/foster parents who have contacted KFFNM through our **Peer Support Line** seeking support and guidance with scheduled family visits.

We are providing the tools in PDF which can be printed in your home or the tools can be used, by you, as a model for creating your own safety plans.

We suggest:

- Create your Family Safety Plan to identifying universal safety steps followed by your household members and then consider any additional safety measures required for individual with compromised health risks.
- Provide a copy of your Family Safety Plans to your CFS agency and the child's CFS agency.
- Keep a record of who you provided your family safety plan to and the date it was provided.
- It is appropriate, during this exceptional situation, to ask the child's CFS agency what steps the agency and the birth parents will take to ensure everyone's safety.
