Federal legislation was passed designating September 30th as National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. This day is intended as an opportunity to learn about, acknowledge and commemorate the history and legacy of Residential Schools in Canada. September 30th was previously observed as Orange Shirt Day to recognize Phyllis Webstad, a residential school survivor, who was stripped of her new orange shirt given to her by her grandmother on her first day at a BC residential school. As foster parents, we can plan to actively participate to honour the survivors, families and communities impacted by this history. Be a part of reconciliation in some small, yet significant way!
